The above-named resource is being nominated as a California Historical Landmark (Landmark). The State Historical Resources Commission (Commission) is scheduled to take action on this nomination at its next regular quarterly meeting. Details regarding the meeting are on the enclosed notice. At the meeting, any interested party, government entity, or member of the public may address the Commission regarding the nomination prior to the Commission taking action on the nomination. Any interested party, government entity, or member of the public may also submit to the Commission written comments regarding the nomination. Comments should be submitted to California State Parks, Attn: Office of Historic Preservation, Julianne Polanco, State Historic Preservation Officer, 1725 23rd Street, Suite 100, Sacramento, California 95816. So that the Commission may have adequate time to consider such comments, it is requested, but not required, that such comments be submitted to the State Historic Preservation Officer 15 days before the meeting.

Landmarks are properties that are of statewide significance and have anthropological, cultural, military, political, architectural, economic, scientific or technical, religious, experimental, or other value. The criteria governing the historical designation of a property is that the property must be the first, last, only, or most significant of its kind in the state or within a large geographic region (Northern, Central, or Southern California). Landmarks are automatically listed in the California Register of Historical Resources. Resources listed in or eligible for listing in the California Register must be given consideration in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) review process.
